

Pailyness

Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. (John 15:4)

A FEW PRACTICES OF DAILYNESS

Daily Devotion: At the heart of dailyness is our time spent with God in Bible reading and prayer. To help this practice form in us, we are using the devotional Seeking God's Face, by Philip Reinders (see next page for details). Get your copy and participate with us!

Daily Attention: One of the key spiritual faculties each of us needs to develop is our ability to notice how God is with us, how He might be leading us, and teaching us. We call this paying attention. We want to learn this way together, regularly reporting on what we are noticing. Daily Connection: The Christian life is primarily about our connections, and only secondarily about our disciplines and commitments. If righteousness is "right-relatedness", then consider how you can best connect. Grab a coffee with a friend, show up to events and gatherings, and be with people.

Daily Service: Service is more than an event you sign up for: service is a way of thinking and being, which finally becomes an identity. Paul, following his master Jesus, called himself a servant.

What would it be like then, to be conscious of daily ways of helping, assisting, and attending?

Don't think first of the big things you can do, but of the smaller, less-noticed things.

Discipleship Team

We believe that discipleship is at the heart of what it means to be a Christian. Discipleship is the experience of following Jesus and becoming more like Him in the process. Learning from Him, observing Him, and spending time with Him. It also involves serving alongside Him, being sent out by Him, and being empowered by Him. In addition to this, these disciples make other disciples.

This year at UCM, we want to intentionally call students to follow on this discipleship walk. This means we would like to give you opportunities for both service and leadership. If you choose to join the discipleship team, there will be moments throughout the year to learn ways of being with Jesus, ways of serving, and also a consistent encouragement to make other disciples. This will happen through meetings with a staff member, larger team meetings, service opportunities, and a variety of other avenues for our discipleship to grow throughout your time on campus.

This includes growth in spiritual practices, life transformation, and beginning to lead others. We hope that by participating and committing to a discipleship team, students will be equipped with practices to follow Jesus and grow into healthy individuals (spiritually, emotionally, physically, and socially), and to learn how to bring others along with you. Talk to any of our staff members about what it looks like to join us on a deeper discipleship journey.

OUR DEVOTIONAL THIS YEAR:

Seeking Gods Face

It is year four of our community commitment to dailyness. This year, we want to anchor our prayer by following the devotional resource Seeking God's Face: Praying with the Bible Through the Year, by Philip Reinders.



This resource provides daily scripture readings, quiet listening prompts, set prayers, and a closing blessing. Additionally, the devotional follows the seasons and celebrations of the Christian calendar, which urges us to take our lives and place them in the broader story of Jesus, allowing our lives to be shaped by the rhythm of His life!

Each day of prayer contains a complete 'office' to pray, and a number of elements for you to pray with, either quietly or aloud. The daily pattern of prayers contains a Psalm, a Bible passage, time for silence, free prayer, set prayer, and a blessing to carry with you throughout the day.

As we participate in the Seeking God's Face daily readings together, we seek to be shaped, formed, and transformed by the Holy Spirit's indwelling presence in our community and in our own lives.

Identities

We live our lives from the identities we embody. How we understand ourselves and our stories influences not only how we live but also how we approach God. Thinking about identities can feel self-centred, but by always posturing our identities back to our relationship with God, we can see where our worth is truly rooted. Our walk with Jesus can become freer as we learn to live from a place of truly being ourselves and who God made us to be in a larger story.



At the Convergence and our accompanying conversations, we will discover healthy identities through exploring our deep inner-worlds, our broad public lives, and how God is present in between it all, not just in our weekly worship gatherings or prayer meetings, but in the everyday. Understanding ourselves through the kaleidoscope of our God-centered identities can transform our whole way of being and help us walk with a practice of dailyness and a faith lived out in the motions of the mundane and the ordinary.

Throughout our university experience, we are all shaped and moulded by what we do, who we spend time with, and what we are learning.



Wepartner with many Calgarycampusministries and meet throughout the year to foster community and partnership between Christian groups.




The Table
